Marion Growth and Statewide Comparisons:

July 1, 2011 – 35,212 (Source: State Data Center of Iowa) April 1, 2010 – 34,768 (Source: 2010 U.S. Census) April 1, 2000 – 26,294 (Source: 2000 U.S. Census)

The City of Marion has experienced a estimated population gain of 444 people since the April 1, 2010 U.S. Census that represents a percent change of 1.27%. The City of Marion had previously grown 8,474 people (or an average of 847 persons per year) between the 2000 and the 2010 U.S. Census which resulted in a percent change of 32.2% over a 10 year period.

The Marion population growth of 444 people from April 1, 2010 to July 1, 2011 has resulted in Marion having the 10th highest population gain of all communities in Iowa. Marion had in the past decade had the highest numeric population gain of any community in Iowa outside of the Des Moines Metro Area, but per the 2010 to 2011 growth estimates the communities of Cedar Rapids (1,579), Davenport (1,117), Iowa City (1,074) and Dubuque (597) all posted larger population gains than Marion over the past year for communities outside the Des Moines Metro Area.

The City of Des Moines experienced the largest estimated growth in population from the 2010 Census with an gain of 3,166, followed by Cedar Rapids with a gain of 1,579 and West Des Moines with a gain of 1,300 persons.

Marion's numeric gain results in a population growth of 1.27% over the past year which is the 83rd highest percentage gain of all lowa Communities but is the 12th highest of any lowa Community with a 2011 Estimated population of over 10,000 people. The City of Clive, part of the Des Moines Metro Area had the largest percent change from 2010 to 2011 with 2.66% followed closely by West Des Moines with 2.30% for communities over 10,000 in total 2011 estimated population. The community of Linden (210 total population) located in Dallas County west of Des Moines experienced the highest percent change of 5.53%.

Per the 2000 U.S. Census Marion was the 18th largest city in Iowa and per the 2010 U.S. Census Marion was the 14th largest community, this has remained unchanged with the 2011 Estimate.

The chart below identifies the lowa communities with a population over 10,000 people and the estimated numeric growth and percentage growth change along with state rankings.

For historical purposes, Marion's only population dip in a census year occurred between 1910 to 1920 with the population going from 4,400 to 4,138 (-262). The population shift was likely caused by several events both locally and worldwide including the moving of the County Seat to Cedar Rapids, World War I and the Flu Epidemic of 1917. Additional Marion population benchmarks in a Census year include a population of 5,000 or greater in 1950, 10,000 or greater in 1960, 20,000 or greater 1990 and 30,000 or greater in 2010. Marion will likely reach the 40,000 or greater population prior to the 2020 U.S. Census.
