

The following information was compiled by the Marion Planning and Development Department with data / information from the US Census and State Data Center of Iowa on May 25, 2017. When completing request specifically for regional, state and federal dollar funding, reporting, etc, the question of what is the population of the community, the agency is typically asking for the Official 2010 US Census Population and or certified population, NOT the estimate, unless they specifically ask for an estimated current population.

Marion Growth and Statewide Comparisons:

July 1, 2016 – 38,480 (Estimate Source: State Data Center of Iowa)

April 1, 2010 – 34,768 (Source: 2010 U.S. Census)

Marion conducted a Special Census and has a certified population of 38,023 on March 17, 2015. The Special Census only targeted specific high growth areas of the community and was not a community wide population count.

The City of Marion has experienced an estimated population gain of 3,339 people since the July 1, 2010 estimate that represents a percent change of 9.50%. The City of Marion had previously grown 8,474 people (or an average of 847 persons per year) between the 2000 and the 2010 U.S. Census which resulted in a percent change of 32.2% over the 10 year period.

The following table provides the estimated growth by year from 2010 to 2016. Please note estimates are always provided for the year prior to this report and are amended by the State Data Center of Iowa every year. If Marion continues to grow at the current yearly average the City will have a population exceeding 40,000 with the 2020 Census.

Marion's population growth of 3,339 people from July 1, 2010 to July 1, 2016 has resulted in Marion having the 13th highest numeric population gain of all communities in Iowa. Marion had in the past decade had the highest numeric population gain of any community in Iowa outside of the Des Moines/Ames Metro



Area, but per the 2010 to 2016 growth estimates the communities of: Ames, Iowa City, North Liberty and Cedar Rapids, all posted larger population gains than Marion over the past six years for communities outside of the Des Moines Metro Area, all but North Liberty are significantly larger communities.

The City of Ankeny north of West Des Moines experienced the largest estimated growth in population from the 2010 estimate with a gain of 13,045 followed by Des Moines with a gain of 11,282 and West Des Moines with a gain of 7,857 persons.

Marion's numeric gain from the 2010 Estimate to the July 1, 2016 estimate results in a population growth of 9.5% % which is the 41st highest percentage gain of all Iowa Communities but is tied for 9th highest of

any Iowa Community with a 2016 estimated population of over 10,000 people. The City of Tiffin, had the largest percent change from 2010 to 2016 with a gain of 54.40% followed by Bondurant with a gain of 50.20%.

FACT: Only 41 (or 4.3%) of Iowa's 944 incorporated cities have a population of more than 10,000 people, but account for half (50.6%) of Iowa's total population.

Linn County has continued to maintain strong population growth from 2010 to 2016 and remains the second most populated county in Iowa with a population of 221,661. Polk County is the largest in Iowa with a population of 474,045.

26 Counties experienced an estimated population gain with Polk County with an estimated population

growth of 43,410 Linn county saw an estimated growth of 10,432 persons during the same 2010 to 2016 time period. Dallas County remains one of the fastest growing communities in the nation with a 27.8% change from the 2000 population. The remaining 73 counties experienced a population decline with Clinton County seeing the largest decline of approximately 1,807 people.

Most Linn County communities saw population growth since 2010. With Cedar Rapids experiencing the largest population gain and Mount Vernon experiencing a slight population decline.


HISTORICAL POPULATION DATA

The following information is historical population data that had been provided in past reports for the last decade growth as well as population bench marks reached by the City of Marion.

The table below recent historical data for population by year from 2000 to 2010, estimates were provided by the lowa Data Center and were revised every year as additional information is collected to create a more accurate estimate.

For historical purposes, Marion's only population dip in a census year occurred between 1910 to 1920 with the population going from 4,400 to 4,138 (-262). The population shift was likely caused by several events both locally and worldwide including the moving of the County Seat to Cedar Rapids, World War I and the Flu Epidemic of 1917. Additional Marion population benchmarks in a Census year include a population of 5,000 or greater in 1950, 10,000 or greater in 1960, 20,000 or greater 1990 and 30,000 or greater in 2010. Marion will likely reach the 40,000 or greater population prior to the 2020 U.S. Census.



FACT: Since 2010, 243 cities have gained population, 652 have lost population and 49 had no change.





If you are looking for additional data beyond population please use the American Community Survey Data. The American Community Survey is an ongoing statistical survey by the U.S. Census Bureau, sent to approximately 250,0000 addresses monthly (or 3 million

per year). It regularly gathers information previously contained only in the long form of the decennial census.
