GARBAGE

- All material must be out at the curb by 7 a.m. on collection day, placed within 3 feet of the curb.
- Multiple containers should be set parallel to curb.
- Receptacle shall be a metal or plastic reusable container with a removable lid and handles.
- Container should not be more than 33 gallons in size, and weigh less than 40 pounds.
- Plastic trash bags may also be used.
- Ashes and sawdust should be placed in a separate bag.
- No animal waste will be collected.
- Do not mix yard waste and garbage.
- One can or bag allowed per week.
- Additional garbage must be tagged with a \$2.50 sticker. Stickers may be purchased at: Marion City Hall, Marion Public Services Facility, Casey's General Stores: 7th Ave, Lindale Dr and S. 11th St, Fareway: Marion and 1st Ave in Cedar Rapids, BP: East Post Rd, Hy-Vee Stores: Marion and Mt. Vernon Rd in Cedar Rapids, Hy-Vee Drug Store: Boyson Rd in Cedar Rapids, Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh: 7th Ave, Kum & Go: 7th Ave and Blairs Ferry Rd.
- The City will transition to automated curbside collection in the fall of 2024. Find the latest information at www.cityofmarion.org/automatedcollectionstudy.

SPECIAL GARBAGE COLLECTION

For large, heavy items not allowed under regular collection

- Special collections are done on Mondays by appointment and must be scheduled the week prior. Special collections must be pre-paid, credit cards accepted.
- Cost is \$40 for every 15 minutes at the curb. Additional fees apply per item.: appliances (\$10 ea), cardboard (\$20 /stop), televisions (\$15 ea), tires (\$10 ea), electronics (\$10 ea)
- Toxic/hazardous materials, propane tanks, auto parts, shingles, commercial remodel debris or concrete will not be collected.
- If collection includes private remodel debris, the landfill ticket cost will be added.

YARD WASTE

- Yard waste is collected at the curb on collection day, the first full week of April through the last full week in November.
- Grass clippings must be placed in paper bio-degradable bags.
- All other yard waste may be placed in 33 gallon cans, clearly marked with a 'Y' facing the street.
- Sticks, limbs and brush larger than 1 inch but no more than 4 inches in diameter must be bundled and tied securely with biodegradable twine.
- Bundles cannot measure more than 3 feet in any dimension or weigh more than 40 pounds.
- Sod or dirt are not accepted at the curb or compost site.
- Yard waste and garbage may not be mixed.
- Raking leaves or mowing grass into the street is prohibited in Marion.

Brush Collection

- You may schedule brush collection to be picked up on Tuesday.
- Fee is \$40 for every 15 minutes at the curb.
- Brush and limbs should be stacked neatly at the curb, parallel to the street.
- Must be scheduled in advance and pre-paid.
- Residential service only, no business or commercial.
- Call 319-377-6367 to schedule.

Yard Waste Facility

- Located just south of 195 35th Street.
- Marion refuse customers may bring yard waste to the facility at no charge.
- No garbage or plastic bags will be accepted.
- There are separate piles for grass, leaves and brush.
- Limbs may be no larger than 6 inches in diameter.
- No sod or dirt accepted.
- Compost and bark chips are available at no charge, residents must load on their own.

RECYCLING

- The City provides a single 18 or 32 gallon recycling bin to all newlyconstructed homes.
- Bins are to remain with the home upon selling.
- The homeowner is responsible for replacing lost or damaged bins.
- Only Marion-issued bins will be emptied curbside.
- Additional recycling containers and/or lids may be purchased from the Public Services Department.
- Bins must be out by 7 a.m., placed within 3 feet of the curb.
- Bins shall not weigh more than 40 pounds.
- Corrugated cardboard must be cut into sections measuring 2 feet x
 2 feet and placed underneath the bin.
- Oversized cardboard may be dropped off at the Recycling Drop-Off Center (195 35th Street).
- Glass is NOT accepted at the curb. Glass must be brought to the Recycling Drop-Off Center or placed in the garbage.
