Register for programs with just a few easy clicks. Set up your household account for you and your family at www.cityofmarion.org/parks-recreation. For renters, we encourage you to use the online calendar for the facilities to view availability and reserve select facilities. Please note, some facilities still require you to call or visit us in person to complete the reservation process.

**FACILITY RENTAL POLICY** Rent facilities for the current calendar year as well as the next year. For example, you can now rent rooms and pavilions for all of 2023 and all of 2024. Every January, we'll open the following year (on Jan. 1, 2024, the entire 2025 calendar opens). This is a significant change from the one-year policy that was previously in place.

**HOUSEHOLD ACCOUNTS** | Please make sure to set up your household account and add all family members to make the registration and reservation process quick and easy for future use. Please verify all contact information is correct (phone number, email, address, dates of birth, etc.). Please be sure to avoid duplicating your account.

**WAITLISTS** | Please only add your participant to a class waitlist once and make sure it's the participant's name rather than the parent/adult. We'll do our best to try and accommodate people on waitlists when reasonably possible. Waitlist status does not guarantee a spot in that program.

**FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE** | If you or your child would like to participate in a program of ours but cannot afford the fee, please contact the Recreation Division at (319) 447-3590 to discuss your options. Financial assistance is available for those who qualify.

**SWIM LESSON REGISTRATION** | The wait is over! We are now able to accept swim lesson registrations online. Registration for 2023 summer swimming lessons begins on March 6 at 7 a.m.

# **Aquatics Swim Lesson Levels**

**Children Ages 4+** | The following guidelines will help determine which level best fits your child's swimming ability. All children are assessed at their first lesson and might be moved to a different level as necessary. If your child is between levels, please register for the lower one. Students learn many different skills at each level and may need more than one session at each level to pass. These lessons are available for children ages 4 and up.

**Level 1:** Students learn to fully submerge face and body, breathe rhythmically, experience buoyancy, float on front and back and swim on front and back using arm and leg actions.

**Level 2:** Students learn to float on front and back with glide, swim a combined stroke front and back, demonstrate rhythmic breathing, tread water and swim on side.

**Level 3:** Participants must be able to stand unassisted in 3 1/2 feet of water. Students learn front crawl with rotary breathing, back crawl, butterfly arm and leg motions, a kneeling or standing dive, survival float and retrieve a submerged object.

**Level 4:** Students work on strokes, including front and back crawl, swim on side with scissor kick, elementary back, breaststroke and butterfly. They also learn diving, underwater swimming, surface dives and open turns on front and back.

**Level 5:** Students refine the front and back crawl, elementary back, breaststroke, butterfly and sidestroke. They also learn standing and shallow dives, pike and tuck surface dives and front and backstroke flip turns.
