

Population Estimates July 2020 to July 2022

The following information was compiled by the Community Development Department with data/information from the US Census and State Data Center of Iowa on June 1, 2023. When completing requests specifically for regional, state, and federal dollar funding, reporting, etc., the question of "what is the population of the community", the agency is typically asking for the Official 2020 US Census Population and/or certified population, NOT the estimate, unless they specifically ask for an estimated current population.

The City of Marion has experienced an estimated population gain of 270 people since the July 1, 2020, estimate which represents a change of 0.65% The following table provides the estimated growth by year from July 2020 to July 2022. Please note estimates are always provided for the year prior to this report and are amended by the State Data Center of Iowa every year. The July 2023 population estimate will not be available until July 2024.

Please Note: These new estimates from the Census Bureau are based on administrative data for births and deaths and estimates of migration since the 2020 census. Caution is urged in making year-to-year comparisons of population estimates. When the Census Bureau releases new estimates for the current year it also revises estimates for previous years in the decade, so the previous year's estimates may be adjusted every year.

Marion's population growth of 270 people from the July 1, 2020, estimate, to July 1, 2022 estimate has resulted in Marion having the 21st highest numeric population gain of all communities in Iowa. The Cities of Waukee (+4,798) and Ankeny (+3,859) continue to see strong population growth that was seen in the previous decade. Tiffin (+1,189), North Liberty (+901), Coralville (+795), and Iowa City (+325) have the largest numeric change from April 2020 to July 2022 within the corridor communities. While many rural communities throughout Iowa continue to lose population. The three largest Iowa communities of Des Moines (-2,780), Cedar Rapids (-1,313) and Davenport (-1,160) have lost the most population

FACT: Since 2020 it is estimated that 236 cities have gained population, 705 have lost population or had no change.

Marion's numeric gain from the July 1, 2020 estimate to July 1, 2022 estimate, results in population growth of 0.65% which is the 166th highest percentage gain of all Iowa Communities but is the 19th highest of any Iowa Community with a 2022 estimated population of over 10,000 people. Tiffin (pop. 5,808) northwest



of Coralville had the highest percent change between 2020 and 2022 with 25.74%, followed by Waukee (pop. 29,167) located northwest of the Des Moines metro with 19.69%

The map below represents the communities that have been estimated to have lost or no gain (red) population and communities that have gained (blue) population since the 2020 US Census. Rural communities have seen the most widespread loss of population along with many of the urban core communities with strong growth in the suburbs and rural communities within commuting distance of the larger employment centers.





LINN COUNTY POPULATION GROWTH

The population estimate prepared by the Iowa State Data Center has Linn County with a population of 229,033 which is a loss of population (-1,270) between (April 2020) and the July 1, 2021 estimate.

The incorporated communities have an estimated total population of 210,921 which represents 92% of the Linn County population. Marion residents make up approximately 18% of the total Linn County population.

FACT: Only 44 (4.68%) of Iowa's 941 incorporated cities have a population of more than 10,000 people, but account for 56% of the population that live in an incorporated city.



HISTORICAL POPULATION DATA


For historical purposes, Marion's only population dip in a census year occurred between 1910 to 1920 with the population going from 4,400 to 4,138 (-262). The population shift was likely caused by several events both locally and worldwide including the moving of the County Seat to Cedar Rapids, World War I, and a serious national flu epidemic. Additional Marion population benchmarks in a Census year include a population of 5,000 or greater in 1950, 10,000 or greater in 1960, 20,000 or greater in 1990, and 30,000 or greater in 2010, and 40,000 or greater in 2010.





HOUSING UNIT DATA

Housing permit data is provided between January 1, 2000, to December 31, 2022. For current 2023 housing starts please contact the Building Division with the City of Marion. Please note the chart reflects the number of housing units not the number of building permits. A permit for a four-plex is counted as four housing units.



For additional housing information and future needs assessment please refer to the 2022 Housing needs analysis prepared by Maxfield Research and Consulting LLC on October 6, 2022. The study analyzed demographic and economic data, and housing market conditions and provides calculations of future housing demand between 2022-2030. It also suggests housing product types and amounts necessary to satisfy current demand and the demand of projected growth.
