### ne Account Reminders...

**FACILITY RENTAL POLICY** You are able to rent facilities for the current calendar year as well as the next year. For example, you can rent rooms and pavilions for 2023 and all of 2024. Every January, we'll open the following year. This is a significant change from the oneyear policy that was previously in place.

**HOUSEHOLD ACCOUNTS** | Please make sure to set up your household account and add ALL family members to your account to make the registration and reservation process quick and easy in the future. Please verify all contact information is correct (phone number, email, address, dates of birth, etc.).

**ACCESSING YOUR HISTORY** | You can check your registration and reservation history by logging into your RecDesk account. You can view all members of your household and click on the member whose history you wish to view. Next to their name, you will see three boxes: profile, history and calendar. Select history and you will be able to view all programs, memberships and reservations for that individual.

**WAITLISTS** Once programs are full, you can elect to be added to a class waitlist. Please enter the participant's name only once. We will do our best to try and accommodate people on waitlists when possible. Waitlist status does not guarantee a spot in that program.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE | If you or your child would like to participate in a program but cannot afford the fee, please contact the Recreation office at (319) 447-3590 to discuss your options. Financial assistance is available for those who qualify.

**PROGRAM SURVEYS** | After the completion of the program, you may receive a postprogram survey. We ask that you please take a minute to complete the survey and tell us about your experience with the program. Our goal is to ensure we are offering quality programming, and direct feedback from participants/parents is key to helping us attain that goal.

**POOL MEMBERSHIP TAGS** | If you purchased any type of pool membership, please hang on to your membership cards for the following season if you intend to renew your membership. This helps expedite the process each spring when issuing pool membership passes.

### RecAssist – Financial Assistance

The Marion Parks and Recreation Department recognizes that there are Marion residents who are financially unable to participate in programs offered by the department but desire the opportunity to experience the benefits of leisure activities. The department has established RecAssist as a supplement of funds to make recreation and swimming programs available to Marion residents.

Marion residents who are experiencing financial difficulty or who are in a unique, hardship situation are eligible to apply for assistance. It is understood that from time-to-time families may encounter some unforeseen and unfortunate circumstance. If you feel you need assistance, but do not meet the income guidelines, you may attach a letter to your assistance application stating your circumstances. These special circumstances will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

Financial assistance forms are available online or at either Thomas Park or Lowe Park offices. You will need to return a completed assistance form and required proof of income to one of our offices. If approved, you will be required to make 50% co-payment of the recreation program, swimming pool pass and/or pool programs. Those that are approved will need to contact the Recreation office when registering for programs or passes, to account for the assistance participation fees.
