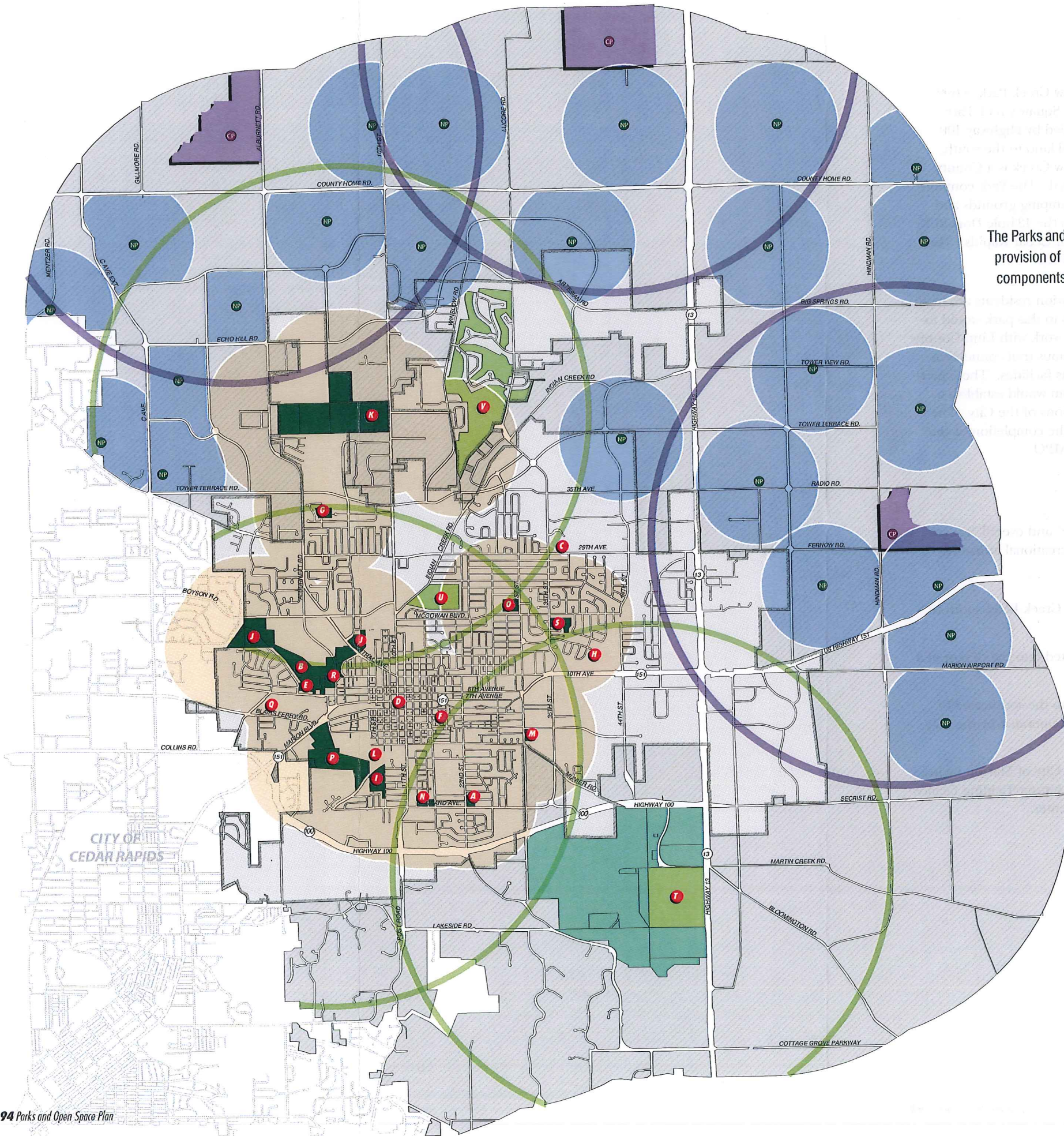

City of Marion Parks & Open Space Plan

The Parks and Open Space Plan seeks to ensure equitable access to parks and open space as well as the adequate provision of recreational facilities and programming for residents of all age groups. The Plan identifies the various components of the park and trail system throughout Marion and its growth areas.



- Public Parks.** The City of Marion maintains 19 parks and several recreation facilities including:

Squaw Creek Park. Squaw Creek Park is the largest environmental feature in the area surrounding Marion. Squaw Creek Park is overseen by the Linn County Conservation Board and contains large areas of woodlands and open space as well as camping facilities and an 18-hole golf course. The main entrance for the park is located off of Highway 100.

- Golf and Recreation.** Residents have access to three local golfing facilities. They include:

 - U Indian Creek Country Club
 - V Hunters Ridge Golf Course

- Existing 2 mile Community Park Service Area

- Municipal Boundary
- Growth Area includes the unincorporated areas outside of Marion and within the City's 2-mile planning jurisdiction.
